Thomas Helps of Balham Hill, co. Surrey; born at Gloucester 13 May 1772; Treasurer of St. Bartholomew's Hospital; died at Balham Hill, aged 70, on Saturday, 4 June, bur. at Streatham, co. Surrey, 11 June 1842. M.I. Will dated 27 July 1840, proved (P.C.C. 408, 42) 21 June 1842, by Thomas Williams Helps and Arthur Helps sons, William Wiltshire Smith and William Ford, the Exors.

Ann Frisquett, dau. of the Rev. Charles Plucknett of Wincanton, co. Somerset; died at Balham Hill, aged 74, on Wednesday, 15 January, bur. at Streatham 22 January 1851. M.I. Will dated 4 January 1851, proved (P.C.C. 122, 51) 1 February 1851, by the Rev. William Plucknett, cousin, Rector of Horsted Keynes, co. Sussex, and Richard Helps of Gloucester, the Exors.

Thomas Williams Helps; of Trinity College, Cambridge, B.A. 1825, M.A. 1828; a Student of the Middle Temple 6 June 1823, called to the Bar 20 June 1828; died at 37 Redcliffe Gardens, South Kensington, London, aged 85, on Sunday, 15 May 1887, bur. in Finchley Cemetery, co. Middlesex. Will dated 23 April 1878, with codicil dated 5 August 1882, proved (Prin. Reg., 614, 87) 27 July 1887, by Catharine Harriet Helps, relict, and Henry Fenton, both of 37 Redcliffe Gardens, South Kensington, London, and George Pemberton Leach of 10 Old Square, Lincoln's Inn, London, the Exors.

Richard Helps of Moorcroft, co. Middlesex; died from the result of an accident, aged 74, on Wednesday, 12 December 1877, bur. in the Helps' family vault at Streatham. M.I. Admon was granted at the Principal Registry 18 April 1878, to Thomas Williams Helps of Dean's Yard, Westminster, brother, and one of the next of kin.

Henry Helps, died at his residence, Wimbledon Common, co. Surrey, aged 45, on Tuesday, 15 November 1853, bur. in the Helps' family vault at Streatham. Will dated 16 February 1853, proved (P.C.C. 878) 9 December 1853, by Sarah Harriot Helps, the sole Executrix.

Sir Arthur Helps of Balham Hill, co. Surrey, of Vernon Hill, co. Hants, and of The Cottage, Kew, co. Surrey (given him by Queen Victoria), K.C.B., D.C.L., F.R.S.; born at Streatham, co. Surrey, 10 July 1813; educated at Eton and at Trinity College, Cambridge, B.A. 1835, M.A. 1839; D.C.L. (Oxford) 8 June 1864; Private Secretary to the Rt. Hon^{ble} Spring Rice (afterwards Lord Monteagle), Chancellor of the Exchequer, Private Secretary to Lord Morpeth (afterwards Earl of Carlisle), Chief Secretary of Ireland, 1839; Clerk of Privy Council 9 June 1860 until his death; employed by Queen Victoria to revise Prince Albert's speeches 1862, and with the preparation of "Leaves of our Life in the Highlands," 1868, and "Mountains: Loch and Glen," 1869; created C.B. 30 June 1871, K.C.B. 18 July 1872; Author of "Thoughts in the Cloister and the Crowd," "Friends in Council," "The Spanish Conquest in America," and many other works; died at 13 Lower Berkeley Street, London, on Sunday, 7 March, bur. in the Helps' family vault at Streatham 12 March 1875. M.I. Admon was granted at the Principal Registry 5 June 1875, to Dame Elizabeth Helps of Kew, co. Surrey, relict.

Elizabeth, youngest dau. of Captain Edward Fuller of Beechmount and Sackville, co. Kerry, by Elizabeth his wife, eldest dau. of the Rev. John Blennerhassett, Rector of Tralee, co. Kerry; marr. by licence at Castleisland, co. Kerry, 27 October 1836; died at The Cottage, Kew, on Tuesday, 10 May, bur. in the Helps' family vault at Streatham 12 May 1892. Will dated 2 September 1891, with codicil dated 5 December 1891, proved (Prin. Reg., 668, 92) 28 June 1892, by Edmund Arthur Helps, one of Her Majesty's Inspectors of Schools, son, one of the Exors.
